
The Little Chapel with the Big Heart

Rev. Gray, who was the moderator of the 217th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and currently lives in Atlanta, asks the question:

"Is your church a Rowboat Church or a Sailboat Church?"

She goes on to say that "Rowboat churches depend largely on human effort. When

church budgets shrink and membership declines, rowboat churches frantically row harder against the current, often frustrated and disappointed at their efforts.



Sailboat churches, on the other hand, take up the oars, hoist the sails, and rely on the Holy Spirit to guide them." (Just to let you know...our budget is not shrinking and our membership is not declining).

It is my hope that as the leadership of Little Chapel reads and talks about this book that we will allow some of what Gray writes to encourage us to move from being concerned about the many daily, practical concerns of the church, to fresh ideas that we can discover by allowing the guidance of the Holy Spirit to direct us.

Please be in prayer for the leaders of the church as we prepare to "hoist the sails" at Little Chapel. As Rev. Gray writes: "God is always calling us into a new future." And hopefully that new future will be with new members...keep reading...

JANUARY SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Session continues its study of Rev. Dr. Joan Gray's book *Sailboat Church*. Chapter 7 was discussed at our January meeting.

New elders were welcomed: Christine Kennedy, Mary Jo Kohunsky, Barry Lindholm, Ed O'Neil, and Beth Price.

Finance Committee moderators were happy to report that we finished the year 2019 "in the black" for the first time in a few years. Many thanks to all who have helped to make this past year a good one through their financial contributions to God and LCOB.

The 2020 budget was presented by the Finance Committee and approved by the session.

The Personnel Committee announced that Pastor Pat has accepted the voluntary resignation of Emily Donovan, due to personal reasons, effective 1/28/2020. Plans are being made for future youth leadership.

The Personnel Committee has hired Sarah Dyer as our nursery attendant. We welcome Sarah and are happy to have her working with our children. Sarah's mom is Delores Dyer, our office administrator.

Personnel Committee moderators have announced that the committee is developing a five-year plan for staff needs for LCOB. Session members and other members/leaders will be consulted and then plans developed that are consistent with the growth patterns of the church. Let us all pray for God's guidance as the committee goes through this process.

Property Committee reported on the latest committee meeting, at which reports were made on activities by the Artwork Sub-Committee and other property initiatives, including needed manse repairs, safety projects, choir railing, and replacement of some church exterior doors.

The Property Committee presented an "Above and Beyond" Award and Certificate to Jim Martz for his time and efforts in coordinating all the recovery and insurance aspects from Hurricane Florence. The church had a "net" insurance savings of \$23,000! Thanks, Jim!!

The Worship Committee has authorized purchase of Lenten devotional booklets for the congregation, which will be available for use by Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

Traveling Communion will be served to homebound members on March 1, June 7, September 6 and November 1 by church officers.

The Worship Committee announced that the choir will present a choral cantata, "Worthy Is the Lamb" by Lloyd Larson on Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020.

The Session has approved the plan to have an offduty uniformed police officer on our church premises on Sunday mornings, 8:00 - noon for 2020.

There is a Presbytery Community Gathering on January 25, 2020 at Faison Presbyterian Church. Janice Allen is the commissioner from LCOB.

There will be a Called Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 2, 2020 to fill a vacancy on the Board of Deacons.

There will be a meeting for prospective new members on Tuesday, February 11 at 6:30 PM at the manse. New members will be received on Sunday February 16, 2020.

A luncheon, planned by the Membership Committee, will be held on Sunday, February 16 to honor the new members of the church from 2019 and thus far in 2020.

Zoe Laakmann is now taking organ lessons from David Heinzman and will be practicing on our sanctuary organ. Great, Zoe!!

Thanks to Pastor Pat for the lovely dedication of the Sound Room in honor of Tim Karp.

determined, and then, in 1990, sending all \$5,700 they had raised to area non-profits.

FEED THE PIG

You're Helping Feed the Hungry

Approximately 20 years ago, the Little Chapel on the Boardwalk began participating in the Hunger Program of Coastal Carolina Presbytery. In the beginning we referred to this program as the 2 Cents Per Meal project (with inflation it is now 4 Cents Per Meal).

In order to "shine the light" on this project and encourage participation, different creative methods or gimmicks were implemented. Some of you might remember "Walking the Loop for Hunger" and donating 4 cents or more for each mile that you walked.



In 2009, we began to feed "Priscilla the Pig." Perhaps those of you not familiar with

this program miaht have wondered why there is a beautiful ceramic pig in the Narthex. To draw attention to the hunger problem. LCOB adopted Priscilla, and we started feeding her with our spare change.

To get more participation from all ages, the Christian Education Committee ordered small piggy banks from Oriental Trading Company for the children's Sunday School classes to paint and then offer these banks to the congregation.

The children had a lesson on hunger and helping to use their resources to help feed hungry people. The piggy banks were set up in the narthex, and the children handed them out to whomever wanted to participate.

Folks would fill their piggy banks and periodically "feed Priscilla" when they came to church. It has been a really fun way to contribute to the serious problem of hunger in our area.

The children, as well as adults, became aware of the need and eagerly collected & contributed their money. Money is collected each month and then sent to

Coastal Carolina Presbytery's sub-committee earmarked for their Cents-Ability (4 cents per meal) Project.

By participating in this program, our church has the opportunity to write a grant application requesting money for a local hunger project of our choice.

The LCOB Mission Committee is so thankful that Bryan McIntyre has been willing and gifted in writing grants so that we have been able for some years now to help Mother Hubbard's Cupboard.

We may also keep 25% of our collections to donate to a local hunger need.

From January 2009 until December 2019, we have been collecting our nickels and dimes and have been able to contribute \$6,953.61. Can you believe a simple collection of coins has generated almost \$7,000 to help feed the hungry?

In our affluent nation, as well as the Wrightsville Beach area, it is appalling that we still have a large problem of people being hungry.

But we at LCOB can help alleviate the situation one coin at a time by




No one is more cherished in this world than someone who lightens the burden of another.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE TEAM UPDATE

We have a very good blend of long-term Little Chapel folks, experienced property and landscape committee members, and skilled new volunteers on our team. Our 2020 team consists of 14 full time members, a number of volunteers that serve on our 6 sub-committees, and other forums that include special projects, work parties, and focus groups, as needed.

At our January 19 committee meeting, we presented Jim Martz with the "Above & Beyond" award and certificate for all his time and efforts in coordinating all the recovery and insurance aspects from Florence. The net result was that Little Chapel did not have to pay any additional funds to make all the repairs resulting from the storm!

At this meeting the committee also made the following initial approvals for projects which will be funded from our capital improvement funds:



- Choir railing installed to assist choir members on steps
 - Church front doors stained / repaired
 - Camera replacement outside of Church front doors
- Replace Fellowship Doors and install safety push bars
 - Install safety push bars to two (2) Oxford Doors
 - Replace two (2) damaged windows
 - Beach trailer tires replaced
 - Manse repairs / painting

Additional on-going key projects and resources will be supporting our artwork review, the improvements required for our front entrance sign, and technology installations.

Our next meeting will be on Sunday, February 23 which will be held at the Matthew House and will include a tour for Property Committee members.






