APRIL HIGHLIGHTS

Seven new members will be welcomed into our fellowship on Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019. This number includes one new member, Ella Grace Wadsworth, from our Confirmation Class for 2019. Session members met with these prospective new members on Tuesday, April 23, 2019 at 7:00 PM.

The Worship Committee has plans in place for services during Holy Week and on Easter Sunday.

Beach services begin on Sunday, May 5, 8:00 AM at access #4, Wrightsville Beach.

On Sunday, April 28, there will be one worship service, at 10:30 AM, with a covered dish luncheon to follow. We will be celebrating our unity as a congregation before the beach services begin.

The Christian Education Committee has plans in place for the Easter Egg Hunt, Saturday, April 20 at the church at 10:30 AM.

Property Committee reported that they are still waiting for a response from our insurance agency about our hurricane claim. Discussion and plans continue for placement of memorial pavers in front of the church along the boardwalk.

Finance Committee reported that they are analyzing our investment accounts. The financial numbers for 2019 look very positive.

Property Committee is planning to purchase a new trailer for transportation of sound and other necessary equipment to the beach for our beach services. Volunteers are needed to help with the transport and setup each week. Contact the church office.

The session is still reviewing options for dealing with security issues for the church, including activities on Sunday as well as during the week when the church is open.

The next Presbytery Meeting for the Eastern Community, June 15, 2019, will be held in Southport. Elder Beckey Smith will be the commissioner from LCOB.

The session approved plans for Pastor Pat to serve as commissioner from Presbytery of Coastal Carolina for meeting of General Assembly, June 25-July 1, 2022.

At the beginning of the April session meeting, Pastor Pat posed the following question for discussion by the group: "What is the purpose of LCOB at Wrightsville Beach and how do we accomplish that purpose?" Much discussion followed!

Q. If the worship committee, Pastor Pat, and the Directors on staff all work to provide spiritual food or nourishment for our soul and our minds; your committee's focus is on providing?

A. Fellowship opportunities while lunches. enjoying delicious food!

Q. Providing meals or arranging for potlucks seems pretty basic, but there's more to it than that, right?

A. Yes, preparing the menu, making sure kitchen and pantry have items needed. > A. Never too many cooks! We enjoy working together. It's not hard work, there is time involved and this is great time spent together always!

> I especially love being in the Little Chapel kitchen and while it is work, we do have fun, have great teamwork, and I think we all enjoy being a member of the kitchen crew!

> Q. How do you include those, or what accommodations do you make for those who have specific dietary restrictions. food allergies, etc. when you plan meals?

> A. Brenda Parker always ensures that those with gluten issues have something to eat. When we serve seafood, items prepared with peanuts, or other known allergens, we will label the food so that people are aware.




MOTHER

Little Chapel supports Children's Hope Alliance and Elderhaus on Mother's Day

By supporting Children's Hope Alliance (CHA), Little Chapel is giving hope to our children and families in North Carolina. CHA is the combination of Barium Springs and Grandfather Home for Children joining forces to serve children and their families by creating hope now and in the future.

Children's Hope Alliance transforms lives by focusing on three main areas: 1) healing the hurt for children, families, and individuals; 2) providing a safe place for children to live through group homes, therapeutic foster care, and adoption programs; 3) and encouraging a healthy start through educational, prevention, and developmental programs.

Children's Hope Alliance also provides different services in 61 counties in the state. Last year, more than 3,600 children and families across the state got the help they needed through the nearly 30 specialized programs offered at CHA.

The mission of **Elderhaus** of Wilmington is to promote and sustain the independence of seniors wishing to remain in the community. This is accomplished with the PACE PROGRAM (an all-inclusive care program for the elderly), ADULT DAY SERVICES, and HOME CARE SERVICES.




