ADULT MINISTRIES

I thought you might all be interested in the results of the Adult Ministry survey that was done in July. I feel that the response was excellent and there was a lot of good feedback that I can use to continue to refine Adult Ministries at Little Chapel.

- 1. The majority of people that responded were married. Just one spouse filled out some surveys but for many, each partner responded. There were also many respondents who are widowed.
- 2. The majority of respondents were between the ages of 66-80. This indicates that this age group is the most active in the church and programs need to be tailored to reflect this.
- 3. Within the church, the most important need is for spiritual growth. However, the next greatest need of those responding is for socialization.
- 4. The majority of respondents felt that events/programs that fostered fellowship, meeting new people and personal growth were of the most benefit to them.
- 5. Programs/activities most desired by respondents were:
- Monthly or quarterly meetings or potlucks
- Monthly dining out
- Brown Bag luncheon and learn
- Educational speakers
- Opportunities to get together
- Day trips
- Holiday Events

All are opportunities for socialization & fellowship.

Based on the survey results I have set up some new events/programs;

- 1.Brown Bag Lunch and Learn monthly there will be a brown bag lunch program from noon-2 pm. Each month there will be a speaker, educational program, arts/crafts class, etc. that will be both stimulating and fun. Participants are asked to bring their main entrée and a side while dessert and beverage will be provided.
- 2. *Monthly Dine Out* each month I will choose a new and interesting restaurant for people to join together and try. In August, 12 of us went to Noir Asian Fusion and had a wonderful time.
- 3. *Local Day Trip* monthly day trips will continue as they have been well attended. I already have scheduled trips for this month and October.
- 4. *Out of Town Trip*-monthly trip to an event or program within a reasonable driving distance, i.e. Alabama Theater, Murder Mystery dinner at Duplin Winery, Mike's Farm, etc.
- 5. Other events throughout the month. There are also some other events that I will let folks know about and they are welcome to attend.

There will be a Called Presbytery Meeting on Thursday, August 30 at Elizabethtown Presbyterian Church, for the purpose of calling a new Executive Presbyter to the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina. The current Executive Presbyter, Rev. Bill Reinhold, is retiring.

Plans are being implemented for the organization of the 2018 Nominating Committee, which will nominate new elders and deacons. Those persons chosen to serve on this Nominating Committee will be presented for approval to the congregation at a future date.

Chris McKirachan, Co-Moderator of the Worship Committee, has resigned from the session in order to support her husband, Rev. David McKirachan, in his new position as interim pastor with the Clarkton Presbyterian Church. We will also miss Chris in the choir but look forward to her return in the future. And we are happy that David continues to serve God in this Presbytery.



The Thursday Morning Bible Study will resume on September 13 at 9:00 AM. The study this fall will be Walking with God in the Desert by Ray Vander Laan, which is number 12 in his series - THAT THE WORLD MAY KNOW.

The imagery of the desert depicting harsh conditions such as hunger, thirst, loss of hope is used frequently in the Bible. The imagery of God's provision of water, "Living Water," is also used in both the Old and New Testaments to describe God's amazing grace and provision for us when we are in need.

God does not promise to provide an easy life without problems and difficulties. But He does promise to walk with us, through our deserts in life.

In this study we will explore the reality that it is only when we are totally dependent on God that we find God is closer than ever and we can experience His supporting love and guidance. This video series brings God's Word to life

with astounding relevance together the weaving fascinating historical. cultural. religious, and geographical contexts. Filmed on location in the Sinai Desert. Wadi Nash. Judea Wilderness, Mount Sinai, Negev and En Geri. these illuminating lessons afford understanding of the Bible that be transforming in spiritual journey with God.


